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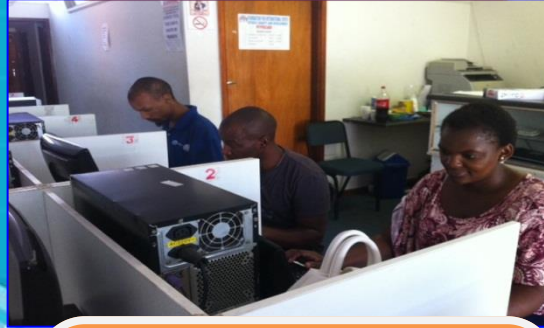

TEENAGE-YOUTH ENTREPRENEURIAL DEVELOPMENT

BACKGROUND

Early teenager-youth entrepreneurship is neglected in South Africa in particular and Africa as a continent. During the early age, many are thought under Career Guidance to take up certain careers so as to be employed. They certainly grow up looking with the ideology that someone else would provide for them the job they want. Much is said and about looking for jobs and prayed for employment. This imbalanced-old-tradition culture has for over the centuries not benefited the continents as many youths struggle to get jobs within or across the borders. Some youths take on dangerous journeys across the Mediterranean in search of employment opportunities. Many have perished and others ending up not using their God given talents or natural endowments which would benefit them and the world.

About 9,000 African immigrants died during their journey for jobs since 2014 (IOM, 2022).

Within Africa, some countries like South Africa and Rwanda are struggling with limited job opportunities for their citizens and cannot provide for both nationals and immigrants who immigrate to the country for these job opportunities. As a result, the scramble for scarce opportunities have led to Afrophobia, crime, corruption, nepotism, exploitation, human trafficking, racism, xenophobia, hatred, murders, and change of immigration laws, negatively affecting even the African immigrant entrepreneurs.

Intra African state and diplomatic relationships have gone sour in some instances because of the poor treatment of foreign nationals within the host countries who are already employed instead of the citizens.

Africa has more job seeker-oriented people than are job makers and this is reflected in the economies. When a nation fails to priorities entrepreneurial development among its people, it remains a low productive with sow. Youth entrepreneurship in Africa

will reduce migration within Africa and to the rest of the world.

Objectives

This program is designed to train the teenager-youths between the ages of 12 to 35 on the need for entrepreneurship and the different ways through which their entrepreneurial skills can be enhanced for their advancement and the society at large. Young people will learn how to identify their skills, development them to grow maximally against contemporary distraction and peer pressures. It will also deal with the different challenges that come with growing a business. At the end participants would have learnt how to focus on bringing the visions into reality.
